

and RPC 1.16(d) (failing to protect the client's interests upon termination of representation), and that no further discipline should be imposed;

And the Disciplinary Review Board having determined that no further discipline is required, and having granted the motion for discipline by consent in District Docket No. XIV-2018-0100E;

And the Disciplinary Review Board having submitted the record of the proceedings to the Clerk of the Supreme Court for the entry of an order of discipline in accordance with Rule 1:20-16(e);

And good cause appearing;

It is ORDERED that no further discipline shall be imposed in this matter; and it is further

ORDERED that respondent remain suspended pursuant to orders filed on May 27, 2015, and August 2, 2016, and that respondent remain on disability inactive status pursuant to the order filed on March 4, 2021; and it is further

ORDERED that the entire record of this matter be made a permanent part of respondent's file as an attorney at law of this State; and it is further

ORDERED that respondent reimburse the Disciplinary Oversight Committee for appropriate administrative costs and actual expenses incurred in

the prosecution of this matter, as provided in Rule 1:20-17.
